MS. JONES: During this time of globalization as well as increasing travel prices, more and more businesses are turning to remote and online meetings, trainings and conferences to save money, stay green and streamline operations.

While video, PowerPoints and shared applications enhance the online experience, there is one key ingredient is missing: Streaming realtime transcription.

MR. SMITH: What is streaming realtime transcription?

MS. JONES: Streaming realtime transcription is the simultaneous transcription of spoken English that is broadcast or streamed live to the internet or elsewhere.

The live streaming may contain minor mistakes that will be corrected as soon as the meeting concludes, and the transcripts will be available immediately in a variety of formats.

Another great feature of our transcripts is a hyperlinked word index. You can click on a word and jump to each place in the transcript where the word was mentioned.

MR. SMITH: Wow! Just having the transcript immediately following the meeting would be great for our minutes secretary. What other benefits might I be missing?
